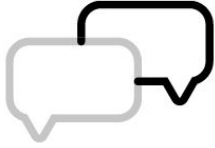

A S K

- What did “the Law and the Prophets” mean to Jesus’ audience?
- Why did Jesus need to address “the Law and the Prophets” here? What was he saying that was “upside down” or different from the previous teachings of the teachers of the Law and the Pharisees? (hint: consider also what comes next)
- What does it mean to “fulfill” the Law? How did Jesus do that?
- What happens to something that has been fulfilled? What does that mean for the Hebrew Law for Christians today?
- What did Paul teach in Galatians and Romans about the Law for Christians?
- How did the writer of Hebrews contrast the Law of Moses with the new covenant of Jesus?
- Explain how, if the New Covenant has fulfilled and replaced the Old, all Scripture can still be God-Breathed and useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.” (2 Ti 3:16).
- How is your righteousness better than that of the scribes and Pharisees?
